Regina Lutheran Refugee Committee: An anonymous donor has given us a matching grant! Any donations that come to us in October will be matched up to \$10,000. St. Mark's will send donors their tax receipts early in the new year.

Financial Update: As of August 31, 2025 the YTD revenue for the General Fund amounted to \$200,258.59 of which \$26,626.75 has been directed to the solar panels (which includes \$3,336.75 undesignated memorial donation); the YTD expenditures were \$161,422.01, resulting in a net surplus of \$12,209.83.

Envelope and Loose Offering: Envelope and loose offering is being collected as you enter the Sanctuary. Prior to worship, please note that the offering plate is on the table at the entrance to the Sanctuary. Please place your offering there as you enter. The plate will only be passed during the service on special occasions.


