It has been one full year since we finished fund raising for Fardous Ginawi and her family of 12. We have all the money and all the furniture we will need for them when they arrive in Regina. We are ready and waiting!

We have also chosen another family, to be sponsored after Fardous. They are Syrians living in Beirut, Lebanon in poverty and in danger. They are Chehade Al Talha, his wife Kholoud, and their seven children. We have submitted their forms through CLWR, and now we need to ask all the congregations of the Regina Lutheran Refugee Committee to contribute to the Al Talha Fund, as they are able. Our goal for this sponsorship is \$50,000.
